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Speeding

Concern:

 Drivers are using many of the side roads as short cuts to avoid congestion along the main routes through Shortlands village

Issue:

Vehicles are often being driven too fast and on roads that are mainly residential, causing danger to other
motorists and pedestrians. This includes Ravensbourne Avenue, Farnaby Road, Bromley Avenue, Glassmill
Lane and Queens Mead Road, which are the first of the areas identified as being of particular concern that
are being focused on

Proposed Solution:

• Install a traffic control by priority system, such as those already in place at Churchfields Road & Kings Hall

Queens Mead Road

Issues:


- Vehicles driving down Glassmill Lane from Bromley to Queens Mead Road are exceeding the 30mph limit, despite the flashing warning signs
- Pedestrians exiting the park through the gate straight on to the road are at risk
 of being knocked down as there is no pavement or crossing point

Proposed Solutions:

- Install a traffic control by priority system.
 This would allow emergency vehicles to pass, and if the traffic approaching from Queens Mead Road towards Bromley had the priority, vehicles coming from Bromley would need to slow down to give way
- Extend the pavement immediately outside the gate




Queens Mead Road – Proposal #1:



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Queens Mead Road - Proposal #2:

Extend pavements on both sides at the single passing channel of the priority traffic control point – on uphill side, in line with outside edge of parking bay



This should create a safer exit/entrance near to the gate from/to the park, and provide a new crossing point across the road

Ravensbourne Avenue & Farnaby Road

Issues:


- Vehicles driving along Ravensbourne Avenue and Farnaby Road are exceeding the 30mph limit &/or are driving too fast approaching junctions (e.g. Downs Hill, Ravensmead Road, Warren Avenue, Bromley Avenue)
- Passengers alighting &/or boarding the 354 bus are at risk of being knocked down
- Parents & children walking to and from Valley School are at risk of being knocked down

Proposed Solutions:

Install flashing warning signs that are triggered when speeds exceed 30mph



Speed indicator light to be installed in a southerly direction midway between the junctions with Farnaby Road and Downs Hill



Speed indicator light to be installed in a northerly direction close to the entrance to Shortlands Golf Club





Farnaby Road - Proposal



Speed indicator light to be installed in an easterly direction close to the foot entrance to Shortlands Golf Club (and 354 bus stop)





Speed indicator light to be installed in a northerly direction approaching the junctions with Bromley Avenue and Warren Avenue



Speed indicator light to be installed in a southerly direction half to two thirds between the junction with Bromley Avenue and Beckenham Lane




Bromley Avenue

Issues:

- Motorists driving along Bromley Avenue aren't slowing down on the approaches to the junctions with Madeira Avenue
- Drivers on Bromley Avenue often ignore the 'Give Way' sign at the junction with Madeira Avenue, increasing the risk of accidents with many "near misses" occurring here each month

Proposed Solution:


 Introduce traffic priority width restriction two thirds down Bromley Avenue from Grasmere Road, with priority for traffic travelling in an upwards direction



Bromley Avenue - Proposal



Traffic approaching from the Farnaby Road end of Bromley Avenue to have priority at the traffic control system






Traffic approaching from the Grasmere Road end of Bromley Avenue to give way at the traffic control system

Introduce traffic priority width restriction two thirds down Bromley Avenue from Grasmere Road
